Please look at the attached flyer regarding our flash sale of current uniform pieces. A reminder that there is a two year transition period where current uniform can be worn including a combination of



How are we here again? At this time of year I am constantly in a tension between what society is trying to tell me and what Jesus is. While the church tells us that we are waiting and journeying to Christmas, everything else tells me to put my runners on and fulfill an endless list of jobs. With Christmas trees, parties and Santa wish lists, we can often forget the opportunity we are given to turn to God during Advent and fully prepare for Christmas.

Entering the Church over the next few weeks, you will notice the transformation straight away. Gone is the green, replaced with a sea of purple. A very clear statement for each of us that something has changed, and so will we. My main question every year, as I lay out the purple cloth and know that Christmas is coming is, How often do I live the real meaning of what Christmas is all about? For many of us, Christmas is about family and friends coming together, sharing a meal made with love and handing out gifts that have been purchased with care and thought. Preparing for Christmas takes time and thought, you can't turn up to Christmas lunch without prior preparation. The same goes for Jesus! Through our witness of them, we can be reminded of the pure innocence and joy we are called to receive every year as we all journey to Christ this Christmas. May we all remember to set aside some time with Jesus this Advent season so we too, just like our children, grandchildren or students can experience the real joy that Christmas will bring.

I'll leave you with one last thought. In years to come, all of the gifts and presents this year will be a vast memory but hopefully faith in a loving God will be lasting. So maybe we need to ask ourselves, how am I actually spending my time as we journey to Christmas?
