Dear Parents/Carers,

Today 3/4 R and 3/4 S ran assembly based around kindness. Using our kind hearts is a great sentiment to practice and remember as we get to the end of the year. Often we are extra busy leading up to Christmas and feel that there are a million things to do, a simple act of kindness can go a long way to make someone's day!

The 2025 Prep Orientation program is well underway, with our second session held Thursday morning. This is such a wonderful time as we get to welcome our new Prep students along with our current and new families. Next year we will be running two prep classes with Emily Toigo and Teagan Hemingway continuing as the Prep teachers.

We will be holding our 2025 orientation on Tuesday 10th December where all students will spend time with their 2025 class teachers and classmates. On this day class structures and staffing arrangements will be communicated to parents.

Langwarrin Community Centre

The redevelopment of the Langwarrin Community Centre to expand and incorporate a Kindergarten and Maternal and Child Health Services has begun. The works are expected to take approximately 12 months. The contractors are staging the building program to ensure that the Community Centre can remain open during the construction period.

I have been assured by the Frankston City Kindergarten Reform Project Officer that every effort will be made to minimise impacts from the construction as much as possible. This includes provisions for construction vehicles and trade vehicles and equipment to park within the Community Centre site.

I have been asked to communicate that the Community Car Park not be used for school drop-offs and pick-ups during the construction period. Additionally, the council is asking parents to be mindful of legal parking around the area, as increased traffic patrols may occur to ensure safety and compliance. 
Calling out for Christmas Helpers!


THE ARTS TEAM


Physical Education

English Writing in 1/2

This term, the 1/2 students have been writing narratives. A narrative text tells a story with an orientation to introduce the characters and the setting, sequenced events, a problem that occurs in the story and how this problem is resolved. Examples are stories in picture books, fairy tales, folk tales, and short stories. Once their original drafts were edited, 1/2P typed their stories and created a front cover.

Working with hands on materials is an important facet of learning in Mathematics.




