
Dear Parents & Carers,

Berry Street Training

A reminder that this Friday (7/3) school will be closed to students as we continue our professional development with the Berry Street Education Model (BSEM). This model focuses on supporting the emotional, social, and academic development of students to help them thrive both in and out of the classroom.

So far, our staff has completed Day 1 and Day 2 of the training, which focused on key areas of teaching and learning:

- Day 1: Body This day focused on how physical wellbeing and sensory regulation are essential for learning. We learned strategies to help students manage their emotions and focus better during the school day.
- Day 2: Relationships This day concentrated on building strong, positive relationships with students. It emphasised the importance of trust, respect and understanding in fostering a supportive classroom environment.



On Friday, we will complete Day 3, which will focus on Stamina, helping students build resilience and perseverance when faced with challenges. This training will help our teachers to create even more supportive, engaging and effective learning experiences for all students.

Our training will conclude with our Day 4 training on Friday 22nd August. The final day will focus on Engagement - strategies to keep students motivated and fully involved in their learning.

We are confident that these strategies will help enhance your child's learning and well-being in the long run. We appreciate your understanding and support as we invest in our staff to provide the best education possible for your child.

The staff level leaders; Emily Toigo, Jessica Bortoli and Shannon White are always part of the group, ensuring a strong connection between the school and its families. This year, all fundraising efforts will go towards installing much needed shade sails over the new junior playground, sandpit, grassed area, and Gaga pit, providing essential sun protection and enhancing outdoor play spaces for students. By working together, the P&F helps create memorable experiences for students, strengthens relationships within the school community, and provides valuable support to enhance the learning environment at St Jude's.

Yesterday was a beautiful change in the Catholic liturgical year, Ash Wednesday and the beginning of Lent. Processing into the church during Lent we notice the 'bareness'. The decorations and colours of ordinary time and replaced in a sea of purple reminding us that we are journeying to Easter.

Ash Wednesday is a beautiful celebration in the Church. Every year, after Mass I am reminded of the public, outward pledge of ashes on our foreheads letting people know that we have been to church! It also begins the dialogue about Lenten promises. So often, the first question I am asked is- what are you giving up? Or how will *you* cope without chocolate for 40 days?

More importantly maybe we need to ask why you might give something up, or should you? If it is just to prove you can, maybe you need a new 40 day promise. Lent is much more than a new challenge, it's about renewing our relationship with God and getting to know Him that

little better by replacing luxuries with prayer. I often tell my students about my favourite Italian Nun, who gives up tomatoes for Lentand that she's so good she gives them up all year (she actually hates them)! She always uses this subject to explain to people that Lent is about taking up, not giving up. Making time for God through prayer and helping others rather than fasting from something in our lives. About making more time for God in our Business. Turning towards, not away from him for the next 40 days.

I invite you to have a conversation with your family about how they want to change as we journey to Easter. Maybe as a family you strive to attend weekly Mass, share a bedtime prayer together every night, or donate pocket money to Caritas. Whatever your family chooses, may God bless you all this Lenten season.



Our Preps are enjoying participating in team/energiser based activities. The Year 1/2 students began the term with teamwork games and are now working on their basketball skills.

In STEM, our Year 1 and Year 2 classes have been exploring the concept of gravity, using planks and ping pong balls to build sloped tracks. Our 5/6s have been learning about translucent and

This term in the Library, the Preps have been exploring rhyming words! We've enjoyed reading stories, listening for words that sound alike, and playing fun rhyming games. The 3/4s have focused on Non-Fiction research, learning about text features and exploring the nonfiction section. They're now ready to start their Mini Project-creating a brochure using their research skills!

In Drama, Prep students have been learning how to move around the room safely. They have also explored simple emotions, such as happy and sad. Students are learning to act out these emotions using their face and body. Year 3/4 students have played a variety of Drama games exploring different voice levels. They have also been working on actor information pages to display in the Drama Room.
