


#### Hello all!

#### How to be energy efficient in winter

Victoria's cold winters mean heating is a major expense for many households. But there are things you can do to reduce costs.

Start with these simple tips for managing energy use during winter:

- Set your heater around 18 to 20 degrees. Every degree higher can increase your bills by 10%.
- Keep warmth inside by sealing cracks, using draught stoppers, and closing curtains at sunset.
- If you have a reverse-cycle air conditioner, turn it on in heat mode instead of using other heaters (like gas heating systems). Reverse-cycle systems are efficient and more affordable to run.

#### Plastic Free July

Plastic Free July<sup>®</sup> is a global movement that helps millions of people be part of the solution to plastic pollution – so we can have cleaner streets, oceans, and beautiful communities. Will you be part of Plastic Free July by choosing to refuse single-use plastics?

#### What does 3 million tonnes of plastic actually look like?

That's how much Australia produces every year, with a terrifying 130,000 tonnes finding its way into the ocean annually.

Knowing these figures and being aware of the problem is important. But not as important as understanding what we can actually do about it.

Together, we can contribute to the global effort and turn the tide against plastic pollution.

#### What can we do?

It would be wonderful if during the holidays you could have a family talk about Plastic Free July. Plastic is the one thing that can take anything from 20 to 500 years to break down. This is a huge threat to our environment.

Just think of the plastic you use in the home, shampoo bottles, cosmetic bottles, toothbrushes, coffee pods, cotton buds, cleaning products.

By choosing to use cardboard containers, reusable bags, reusable water containers, shampoo soaps, keep cups, cosmetics in recyclable containers and many more, you are helping to reduce the effect we as consumers make on the environment around us.
